Dr. JoAnne Castagna, a Public Affairs Specialist and Writer with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, was on West Point last week to teach a mini-class on how scientist can communicate about their research. Dr. Castagna walked researchers through a 5 step writing process utilizing information mapping techniques to write articles for trade journals. The process included using who, what, why, when, where, and how questions to create an attention getting first paragraph, brainstorming specific topical questions, creating an article outline, writing a quick draft and then editing.
